Nova Scotia has the largest population per capita of persons with disabilities in Canada at 20.1 percent.

Nearly one in every five Nova Scotians has a disability.

More than one out of three Nova Scotians with disabilities live in the Halifax Regional Municipality.

An estimated 27, 812, or 53.8 per cent, of persons with disabilities, ages 15 to 64, live in the Halifax Regional Municipality and are not attached to the labor force.
